

ONLY USE AN UPPER TIER CARRIER FOR PALLET COLLECTION

People or businesses who transport, buy, sell or dispose of waste, or arrange for someone else to do so, must be registered. There are two types of waste carrier (and upper and lower tier carrier). If you are using someone else to collect your pallets they must be registered as an Upper Tier Carrier.

Why is this important?

By using someone who is not licenced it encourages rogue traders in Manor Royal and can cause problems for your business if your waste is not disposed of properly.

How do can you tell if they are an Upper Tier Carrier?

Pallet collectors must always have their licence with them. If they cannot produce their licence on request it might mean they are not a licenced Upper Tier Carrier.

How else can I check?

Visit the Environment Agency website and search for Upper Tier Carriers. You can search using either a licence number or the business name.

If they are not registered, do NOT use them!
